Recommended Stocking Rates: Warm and Cool Water Ponds: > 72 degrees.
100 Bass/surface acre. 400 Minnows/surface acre. One acre equals 43,560 square feet.
Initial stocking of new ponds should establish minnows or forage fish first
or increase stocking to 1000 minnows or more per 100 bass due to predation.

Minimum order is 25 Bass or 100 Minnows

Transport: Fish will be distributed in cold water, oxygenated bags. It is recommended that you acclimate the fish to the pond water. This is done gradually over 1 to 2 hours by adding pond water to the bag/container.

at the western edge of the Village of East Aurora.
